



Housing and Economic Empowerment Projects Intern

Under the direction of the Housing and Economic Justice Manager, The Coalition's Housing and Economic Empowerment & Projects Intern will work to identify means of administering the financial empowerment curriculum, which includes collaboration with regional and national coalitions to develop new models for engagement and relevant trainings for AmeriCorps Victim Assistance Program (AVAP) members and the 12 crisis centers across NH. This intern will work with state legal resources to develop awareness of fair housing and tenants' rights and conduct community outreach to develop community awareness of financial abuse and its societal impacts.

The Housing and Economic Empowerment Projects Intern will be able to build pathways for survivors to escape abuse by directly supporting the Allstate Foundations Economic Empowerment curriculum and Matched Savings Program, while developing networks of housing resources and supports for crisis centers and survivors.

Responsibilities include:

- Network with housing committees, programs, legal resources, and community partners to develop support systems, trainings, and materials that housing advocates can turn to for advice and resources for survivors.
- Work closely with the Housing and Economic Justice Manager to develop and support trainings for advocates utilizing the Allstate Matched Savings Program Curriculum
- Network with state and national partners to research and discover relevant training materials and resources for advocates.
- Assist in outreach efforts to banking institutions across the state to inform and educate on financial abuse and the services our crisis centers offer.
- Develop financial empowerment trainings for teens and youth who are victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking, and human trafficking.
- Work to obtain information on fair housing and develop materials and information for survivors and housing advocates.
- Support the Housing and Economic Justice Manager in providing direct support to the AVAP (AmeriCorps Victim Assistance Program) Members.
- Promote awareness across the state about financial abuse and its impact by working with the Coalition's Public Affairs Team, to create relative media and social media postings.
